



Guerilla love groups to assault Festival city

"Urban guerilla love groups" will take to the streets during the Adelaide Festival of Arts next month.

Members of the Jesus Movement will launch a cultural and Christian assault, Kairos 74, on the city.

They will give street performances on footpaths and at high schools and rock concerts in Elder Park.

Jesus people, the Rev. John Hirt, of Sydney, and Mr. Kevin Smith, of Melbourne, said on arrival in Adelaide

yesterday: "We give expression of our Christianity through our art forms.

"A lot of the street theatre will be mime and comment about society.

"One of the groups coming from Melbourne is preparing a play about the Festival and poses the question: What is culture"

One of the Adelaide or-

ganisers of the Jesus Movement Festival programme, Mr. Doug Kuhl, said about 3,000 members from SA and other States would take part.

Mr. Hirt said: "The Jesus family see themselves as catalysts in all levels of society working for human liberation.

"We don't just live for possessions or material values."
